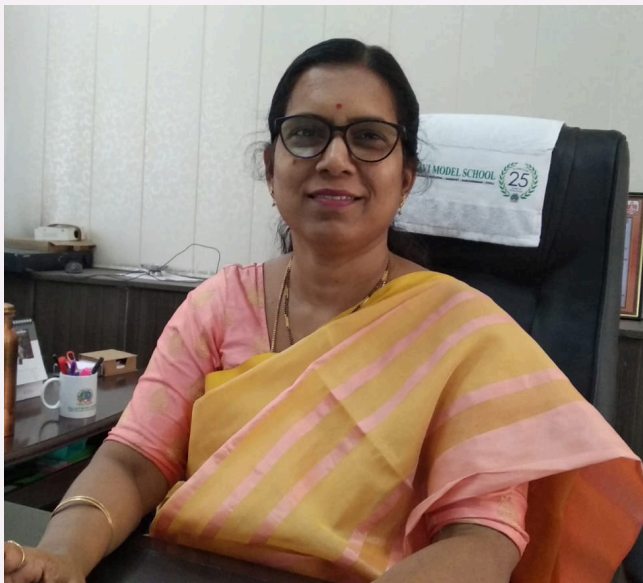

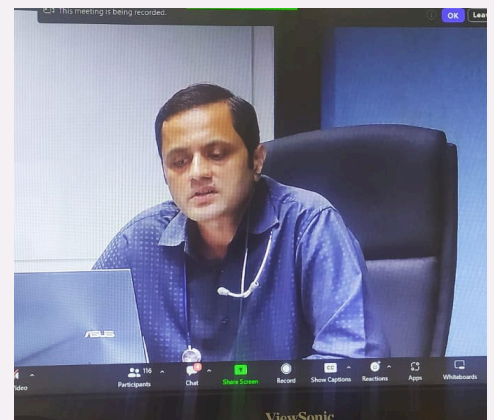

"CHANDRAYAN PROGRAMME"



A special assembly took place on 22 July 2024. "Chandrayaan program" at AVIS for Grades VI to VIII. The assembly started by the anchoring team by Grade VIII students. This special assembly was conducted to celebrate a remarkable achievement in space exploration: India's Chandrayaan program. Students and teachers came together to learn and commemorate this significant milestone in our nation's scientific journey.

The assembly began with the national song, followed by a brief introduction to the Chandrayaan program. Chandrayaan, which means "moon craft" in Sanskrit, represents India's ambitious venture into lunar exploration. It aims to expand our understanding of the moon's geology, minerals, and atmosphere through a series of space missions.

To deepen our appreciation for the scientific advancements achieved by the Chandrayaan missions, Science department HOD Ms. Tejaswi Sriram has provided insights into the technology and instruments on board the spacecraft. She explained how Chandrayaan's payloads are designed to analyze lunar soil, and study its mineral composition, contributing valuable data to the global scientific community.

Students of Grade VIII have also spoken about the ongoing series of outer space missions by ISRO for exploration of the moon. They have also presented a visual representation through excellent chart work made by them. The assembly concluded with a reflection on the importance of Chandrayaan in advancing our knowledge of the universe and inspiring the next generation of scientists and engineers. Students left the assembly area with a renewed sense of pride in India's achievements in space exploration and a deeper appreciation for the wonders of the cosmos.

"ONE DAY KISAN AN ENTHUSIASTIC FIELD TRIP "



Akshara Vaagdevi International School arranged a picnic that included an educational field trip for Grades VI & VII on 24 July 2024 at ONE DAY KISSAN. This trip enhanced students' critical thinking skills and offered them a chance to explore topics from different perspectives.

Many activities were conducted by One Day Kissan. The day began with a warm-up song, "Rim Sim Sam," followed by various engaging activities. The first was understanding the Modern Milling Process (Rice Mill), where students learned about the different stages from grain to rice. They witnessed the mechanisms of small-scale rice and flour mills.

Next was the Vermicompost or Earthworm Pit, where students understood why earthworms are called farmer's friends and how they help make soil fertile. The Hand Grinding activity allowed students to experience using an ancient hand grinding machine, providing insight into pre-electric grinder mechanisms. Other hands-on activities included Dung Cake Making and Pottery.



Students then went into the farm to plough and plant saplings. They also observed water management techniques, including a live reservoir working model and ancient methods like the Persian Wheel and Archimedes' screw. They saw vintage water wells and borewells for domestic use.

The students enjoyed climbing the green castle, exploring a vintage farmer's watch tower, and taking a joy ride on a tractor. They continued with poly house farming and interacted with exotic and domestic birds like emus, pigeons, hens, ducks, and guinea fowls, as well as various animals like rabbits, goats, and cows.



For entertainment, music was played, and students enjoyed dancing. This trip created awareness among the students as they visited a farm, met the farmers, and learned through real hands-on farm work. It helped connect them to their food and understand the importance of farming

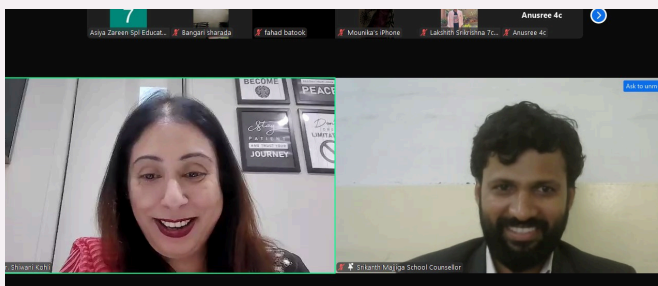

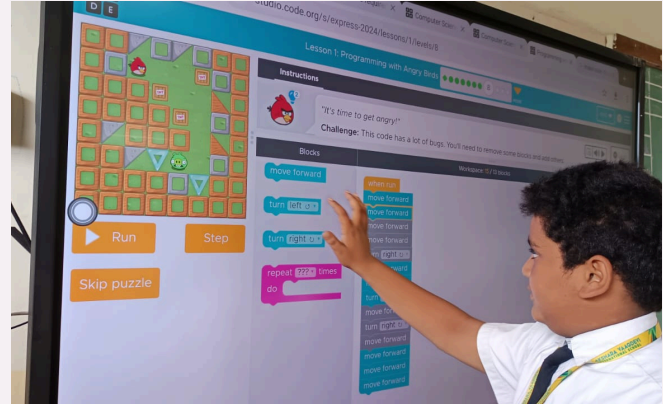

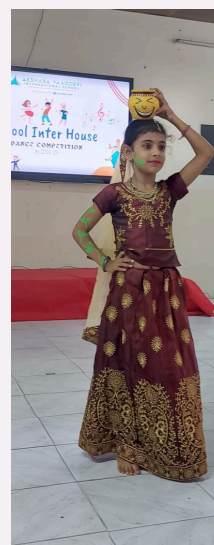
“INTER HOUSE DANCE COMPETITION”

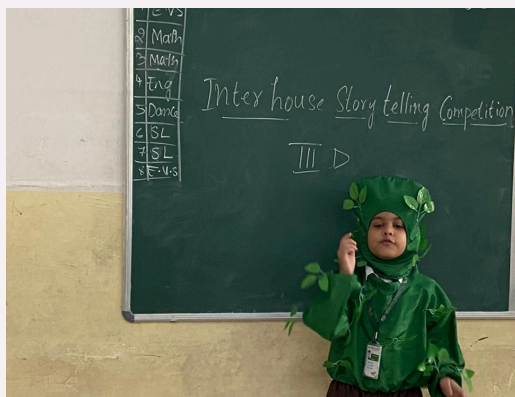

“KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS”



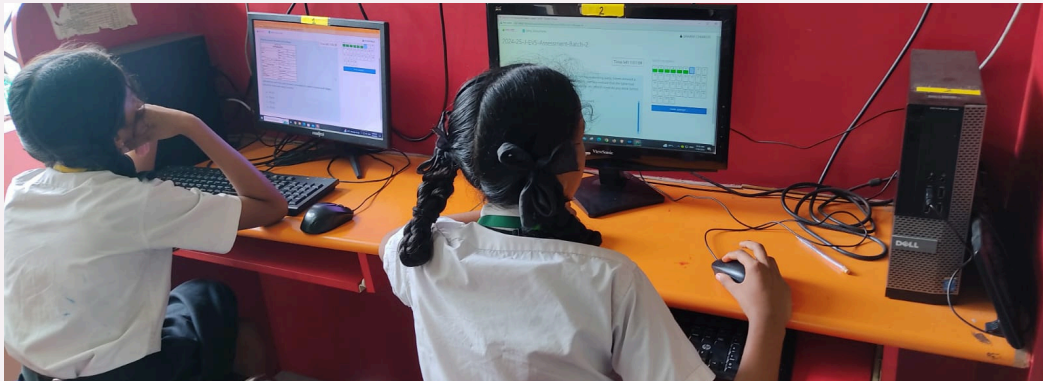
